THE HISTORY OF Kids First Health Care

In August 1978 the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation awarded a five year grant for \$560,176 to Adams 14 to develop a way to improve the health outcomes of school-age children by using the services of Nurse Practitioners in schools. Adams 14 was 1 of 3 sites selected in Colorado to be funded and 1 in 9 nationally.
