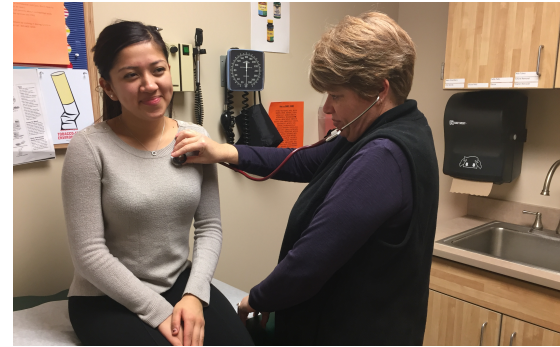

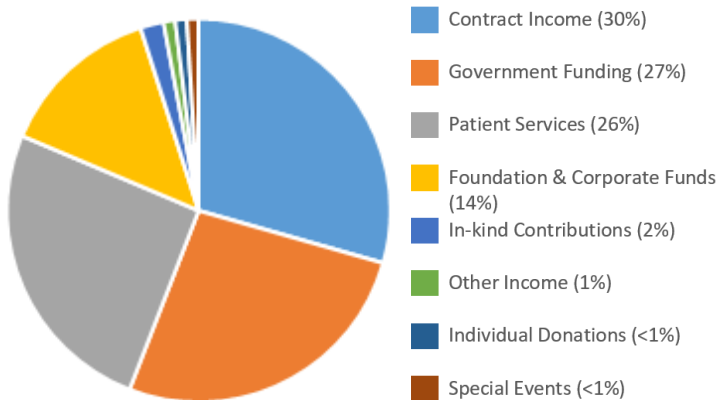

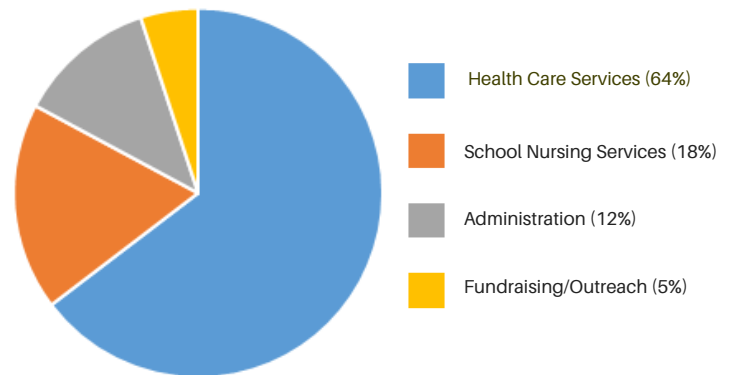


Financial Performance
