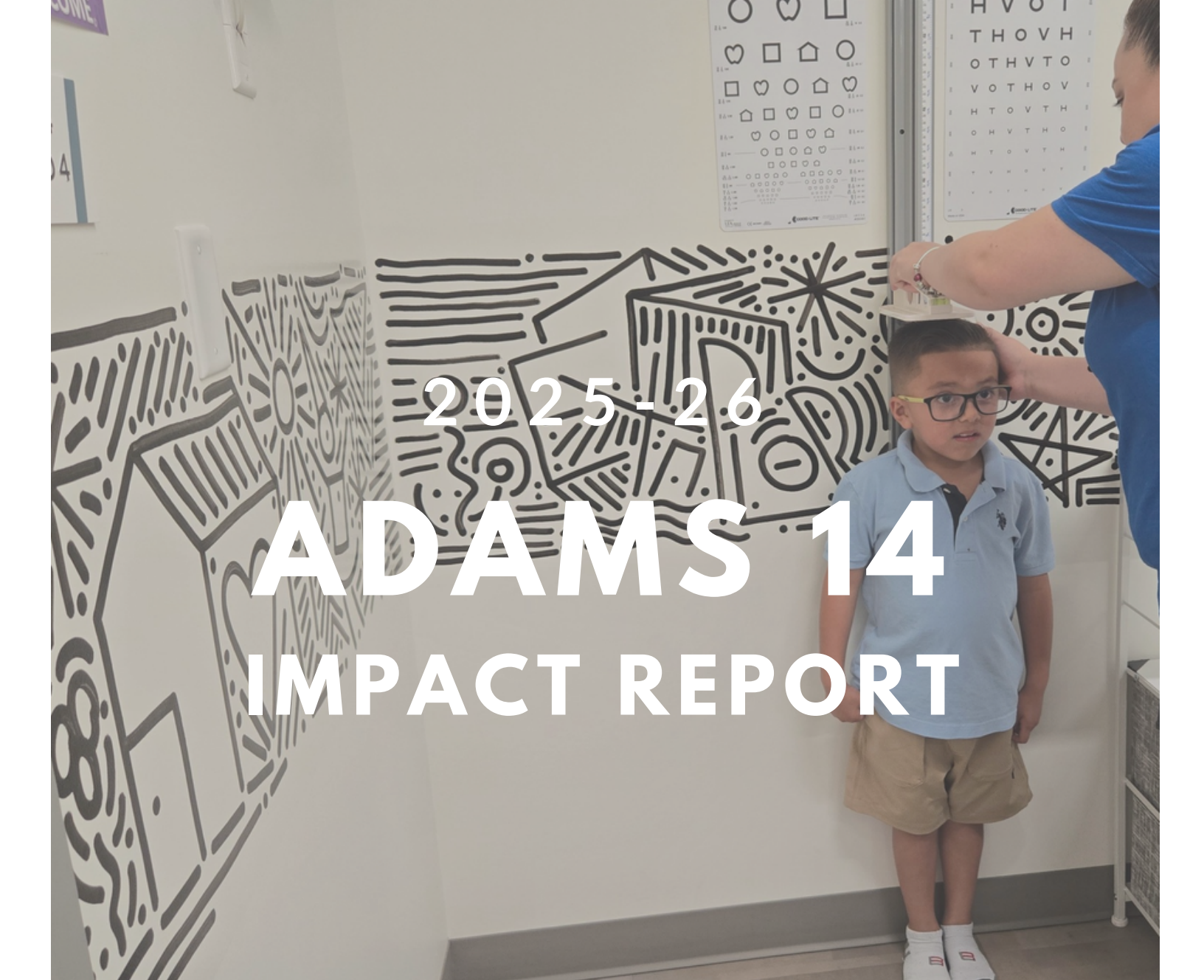

OUR HISTORY

For **48 years**, Kids First Health Care has been a trusted community partner in supporting the **health and well-being of students and families across Adams 14**.

Our roots in this community run deep—**Kids First proudly launched Colorado’s very first school-based health center here**, helping to shape a proven model of care that removes barriers and keeps kids healthy, learning and thriving.

Today, Kids First operates **four school-based health centers in Adams 14**, bringing high-quality, integrated pediatric care directly onto school campuses **where students already are**. Our school-based health centers provide **essential clinical care, at no cost to Adams 14**.

Our Commerce City community clinic serves patients from **birth through age 21**, ensuring continuity of care from early childhood through adolescence and young adulthood.

Together, these sites provide comprehensive medical, behavioral health, and preventive services that **support both academic success and lifelong wellness**.



OUR PATIENTS

Kids First Health Care is the **only nonprofit pediatric health care provider serving core Commerce City**, and we are proud to be a safe, welcoming place for families—regardless of insurance status, income or circumstance.

We are also the **only school-based health center provider in Adams County**.

We believe every child deserves access to high-quality care, and we are committed to serving those who often have the fewest options.

Today, 71 percent of Kids First patients are insured through Medicaid and CHP+, and **21 percent are uninsured, relying on Kids First as a critical health care lifeline**.

Through our school-based and community clinic model, Kids First Health Care **continues to advance health equity in Adams 14**—meeting children and families where they are, responding to community needs, and ensuring that access to care is never determined by zip code or ability to pay.

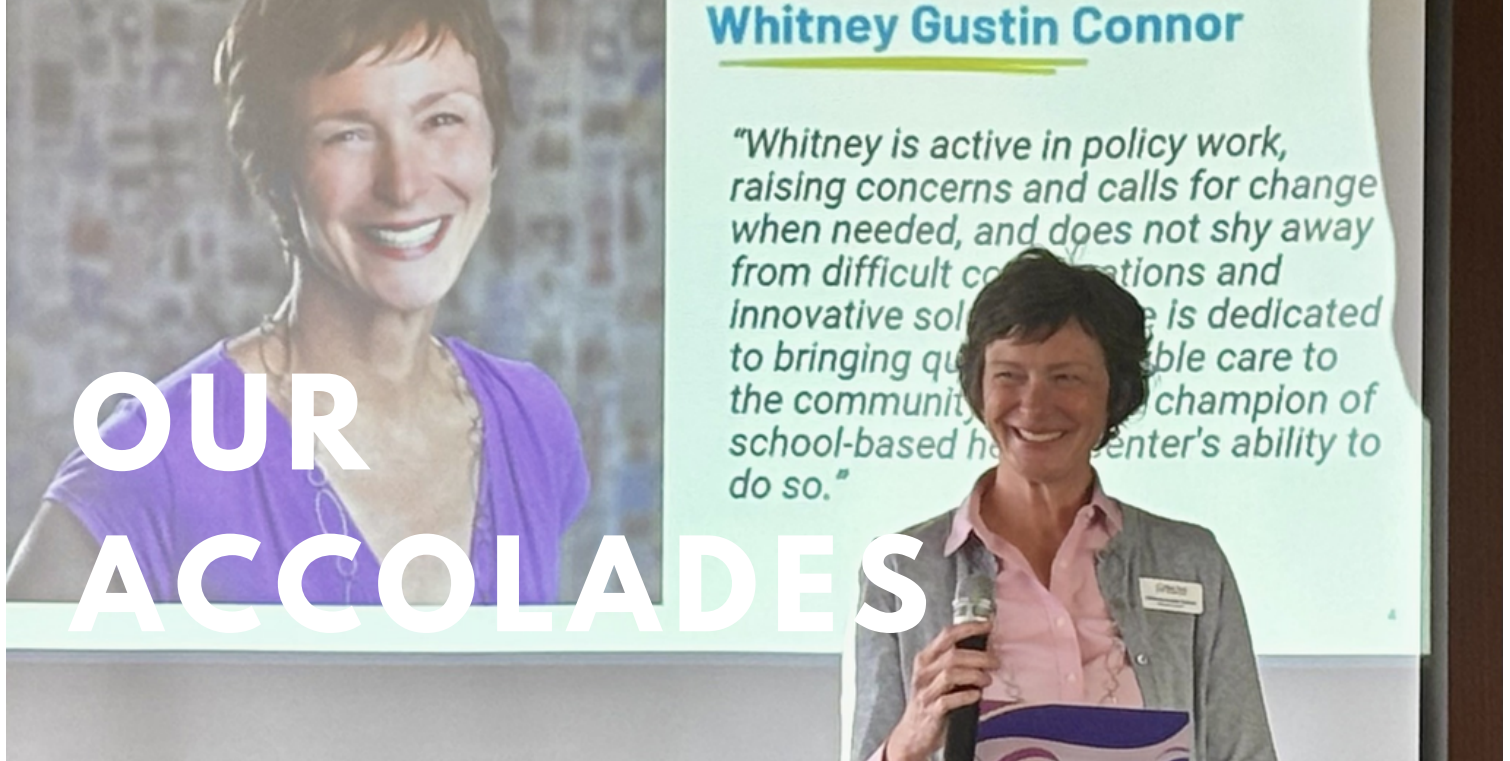

OUR PATIENTS

A student was seen for some follow up lab work at school. Our providers noticed that the student's anemia was worsening, and they were having some worsening stomach pain and stool changes. We had concerns for possible GI ulcer or GI bleed, and needed an ASAP evaluation by a GI specialist. The student didn't have insurance, and family was worried about specialist costs. Our enrollment coordinator met with the family that day (staying late after work hours) to get immediate coverage for the patient, so they could be seen the following day by GI and scheduled for a endoscopy. It was determined that the patient had acute gastritis causing abdominal pain, anemia, syncope and fatigue. After treatment by GI in conjunction with management with the school-based health center, the patient has been doing much better, and has resolution of symptoms!

Through effective collaboration between therapy and medication management, Kids First Health Care successfully supported a student in achieving remarkable progress. The patient worked consistently in therapy while our nurse practitioner managed their medication regimen, creating a comprehensive treatment approach. The student reported feeling more positive and emotionally stable, with increased motivation to engage in daily activities and future planning. Most notably, their academic performance improved dramatically, with better focus, attendance, and grades. The student also demonstrated enhanced overall functioning, including improved relationships with peers and family, as well as greater self-confidence. This case exemplifies how integrated mental health care, combining therapeutic intervention with appropriate medication management and strong professional collaboration, can create meaningful, lasting change in a young person's life.



OUR OUTREACH

Kids First Health Care has demonstrated highly effective outreach in Commerce City, working proactively to connect families to essential care and remove barriers that often prevent access.

Through trusted community presence, partnerships and culturally responsive engagement, we meet families where they are—ensuring they understand their options and feel incredibly supported.

One powerful example is a family served through this outreach: a father who had recently lost his job and was caring for his children on his own. Unaware that he and his children qualified for Medicaid, he had not sought care due to cost concerns.

Through outreach efforts, Kids First Health Care was able to guide him through the enrollment process, securing Medicaid coverage for his entire family. Just as importantly, the children were able to be seen right away, receiving long overdue vaccinations and essential care.

Today, they are established patients with a consistent medical home at Kids First Health Care, ensuring ongoing access to the preventive and primary care they need to stay healthy and thrive.

This story reflects the broader impact of Kids First's outreach in Commerce City—meeting families with compassion, removing barriers and connecting them to the care ALL children deserve.



DENTAL IN ADAMS 14
